## Solid Rock or Stumbling Stone? Matthew 16:13-23

## Review:

- 1. The Church is built on the rock of Peter's faith in Jesus as the Messiah and the Son of God
- 2. Unfaithful Christians can cause people to stumble if we focus on the things of this world
- 3. The faithful Church participates in Jesus' judgment and discipline, as we accurately reflect and apply God's standards to one another and to the world
- 4. The faithful Church participates in Jesus' conquest of death and Hell, as we embody His sacrifice for the salvation of the nations

## Reflect:

1. Is the way you are living giving others a bad impression of what it means to be a Christian? What changes do you need to make to keep from being a stumbling stone for unbelievers?

- 6. According to verse 6, who gathered to make a decision about this dispute?
- 7. In verse 8, how did Peter say God had blessed the Gentiles?
- 8. In verse 9, how did Peter say God purifies the hearts of men?
- 9. In verse 10, what does Peter remind the assembly that none of them have been able to do?
- 10. In verse 11, how does Peter insist that people are saved?
- 11. What did Paul and Barnabas describe for the assembly in verse 12?
- 12. After the debate was over, who does verse 13 say rose to speak?
- 13. How does James summarize Peter's report in verse 14?
- 14. Who does James say in verse 15 agrees with Peter?
- 15. In verses 16 and 17, James quotes from Amos 9:11-12. What does God promise He will rebuild?
- 16. What is the reason that God says in verse 17 that He will restore the dynasty of David?
- 17. In verse 18, what does James say that God knows?
- 18. What four things does James suggest will be sufficient for the Gentiles to stay away from?
- 19. What does James say about the Law of Moses in verse 21?
- 20. Who does verse 22 say made the decision about what to write to the Gentiles?
- 21. Who did the assembly send back to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas? Why was this a good idea?

Summary and Application:

- 1. Why would requiring that Gentile believers follow all the ceremonial Law of Moses have been a stumbling block to them? What sorts of incorrect teaching have you found to be a discouragement to your own faith?
- 2. Given the way the early church made decisions, who do you think should be responsible for making decisions in the church today?
- 3. What kinds of evidence did the Acts 15 assembly use to determine God's will for the Gentile believers? How can we seek truth from the same sources today?
