## The God of the Living Matthew 22:23-33

Review:

- 1. Jesus calls those who focus only on the things of this world to look to the greater, eternal reality of God
- 2. Jesus upholds the absolute authority of the Word of God, using it to prove the reality of the resurrection
- 3. We must submit every part of our lives to God, obeying His Word and worshipping Him alone

Reflect:

- 1. Does the way Jesus uses Scripture to answer His critics change the way you think about the Bible? Describe the authority the Scriptures have in your life.
- 2. What parts of God's Word do you have the hardest time putting into practice?

Go further: Read II Peter 1:16-21

- 1. What does Peter say he has made known to his readers?
- 2. To what does Peter claim to be an eyewitness?
- 3. In verse 17, what does Peter say he heard the Father saying about Jesus?
- 4. When did Peter say he heard this?
- 5. What image does Peter use in verse 19 to describe the way Scripture leads us and guides us?
- 6. Peter says we will need to read the Scriptures until the day dawns. What do you think he means by this?
- 7. What does Peter insist is never a matter of individual interpretation?
- 8. What does Peter deny that human beings could produce by their own will?
- 9. How does Peter say that prophets were able to speak God's Word to us?

Read II Timothy 3:14-4:5

- 10. In 3:14-15, how does Paul counsel Timothy to avoid deception?
- 11. In verse 16, the word "inspired" means "breathed out." Since Scripture is breathed out by God, in what four ways does Paul say it is profitable for us?
- 12. What does Paul say in verse 17 is the result of studying the Scriptures?
- 13. What does Paul counsel Timothy to do in 4:2 and 5?
- 14. Why does Paul say in 4:3 and 4 that Timothy's actions will be necessary?

Summary and Application:

- 1. Describe your practice of reading Scripture how often and how much do you read every day?
- 2. Given the way Jesus used Scripture, and given what Peter and Paul say about Scripture, how do you plan to change your reading habits?
- 3. What favorite Scriptures would you like to memorize? Make a plan to do this.
