#### Review:

- 1. A life that is only concerned with the things under the sun, a life without reference to God is meaningless and empty
- 2. It is important to understand the way unbelievers think so that we can share the gospel with
- 3. A life lived in relationship with Christ brings meaning to every aspect of life

- 9. What does verse 17 insist that the Lord does not do?
- 10. Who does verse 18 say that the Lord blesses, and in what ways?
- 11. How does verse 19 say that we should respond to the Lord's blessings?
- 12. What four things does verse 20 say we should do in order to express our close relationship to God?
- 13. In what two ways does verse 21 describe the Lord?
- 14. What does verse 21 say that the Lord's people have seen?
- 15. Who does verse 22 say went down into Egypt?
- 16. Starting from that point, what did the Lord do for His people?
