## The Test of Love Genesis 44

#### Review:

- 1. Since all of us have sinned, when we face injustice or unfairness, we should come before God in humble confession, not in angry self-righteousness
- 2. True repentance requires not just sorrowful confession, but active turning away from our sin and turning toward God
- 3. True love is like the love of Christ: willing to keep its promises to sacrifice itself for the benefit of the undeserving

### Reflect:

- 1. In what areas of your life are you holding back from God and from others the love that He and they deserve?
- 2. Is there someone among your family or close friends who you don't feel is worthy of your help? What can you do to express your love for them?

### Go further: Read Psalm 81

- 1. In verse 1, how does Asaph urge us to worship? How does he describe God?
- 2. In verses 2 and 3, what instruments does Asaph say we should use in our worship?
- 3. On what special occasion does Asaph say worship is appropriate?
- 4. According to verse 4, Who commands us to worship in this way?
- 5. When does verse 5 say that Israel received this commandment?
- 6. What does verse 5 say happened to Israel during their time in Egypt? Why would this situation pose a problem for the Israelites?
- 7. Starting in verse 6, we hear God speaking for the rest of the Psalm. How does God say He has relieved His people?
- 8. In verse 7, how does God describe His reaction when His people called out to Him?
- 9. What does God say He did to His people at the waters of Meribah?
- 10. What does the Lord want His people to do in verse 8? Why is this so important in worship?
- 11. What does God forbid His people to do in verse 9?
- 12. In verse 10, what does God say He has done for His people? What does He want to give them?
- 13. According to verse 11, what two things did God's people not do?
- 14. According to verse 12, what did God do to His people in return?
- 15. According to verse 13, what two things does God want His people to do?
- 16. In verse 14, what two things does God promise to do if His people would obey Him?
- 17. In verse 15, what does God promise will happen to those who hate Him?
- 18. How does God promise to bless His people in verse 16?

# Summary and Application:

1. According to Numbers 10:10, God commands His people to worship Him by blowing trumpets. Why do you think such obedience is an essential part of worship?

- 2. Exodus 17:1-7 tells the story of how the people grumbled against Moses because they had no water to drink at Meribah. How does this behavior form a contrast with a true attitude of worship?
- 3. Given everything Asaph has told us in Psalm 81, in what concrete ways can we express our love and devotion for God?
