Review:

- 1. God has kept His promise to make all who trust in Christ His people, heirs of Abraham.
- 2. God will keep His promise to live with us forever in a new heaven and a new earth.
- 3. The Lord has blessed us His Holy Spirit to empower and encourage us today.

Reflect:

1. How does thinking about God's faithfulness to keep His promises increase your faith in Him?

Go Further: Read Psalm 111

- 1. According to verse 1, who does the psalmist think is worthy of praise? How does he describe the way he gives thanks and praise to God?
- 2. With whom does the psalmist say he will give God his thanks and praise?
- 3. In verses 2 and 3, how does the psalmist describe God's works? Who does he say will study them?
- 4. How long does the psalmist say that God's righteousness will last?
- 5. What does the psalmist say will be remembered?
- 6. How does the psalmist describe God in verse 4? What evidence does he give of this in verse 5?
- 7. What does the psalmist say God will remember or be mindful of? For how long will His memory last?
- 8. According to verse 6, what will God declare or make known to His people? How will God do this?
- 9. According to verse 7, what two things did God make with His hands? How does the psalmist describe God's precepts?
- 10. In verses 7 and 8, what four things does the psalmist say about God's precepts or commandments?
- 11. In verse 9, what does the psalmist say God has done for His people?
- 12. What has God ordained or commanded forever?
- 13. How does the psalmist describe God's name?
- 14. In verse 10, what does the psalmist say is the beginning of wisdom?
- 15. How does he describe those who do or carry out God's commandments?
- 16. How long does the psalmist say God's praise will last?

Summary and Application:

- 1. How has God demonstrated His grace and compassion in your life? How has He displayed His power on your behalf?
- 2. Given that God never goes back on His Word but always keeps His covenant promises, why does it make sense for His people to keep His commandments? Why is obedience appropriate for such a faithful, never-changing God?
