# Cloud and Fire I Kings 8

#### Review:

- 1. God filled His Temple with His glory cloud, keeping His promise to dwell among His people
- 2. God once again filled His Temple, the Church, with the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost
- 3. But instead of driving those who trust in Christ out of God's presence, the Holy Spirit makes us fit to live with Him forever

### Reflect:

- 1. How close do you feel to God today? Is there something in your life that makes you think you are unworthy to be in the Lord's Presence? Pray about that.
- 2. The Holy Spirit fills all those who trust in Christ. Is that assuring to you? Why or why not?

### Go Further: Read Acts 2:14-41

- 1. In verse 14, to whom does Peter address his sermon?
- 2. In verses 17-21, Peter quotes from Joel 2:28-32. In verse 17, when does God say He will pour out His Spirit? On whom will the Spirit be poured out?
- 3. What does God say the Spirit will enable people's sons and daughters to do?
- 4. What will the Spirit enable young men and old men to do?
- 5. How does verse 18 describe those who will receive the Spirit of God?
- 6. What signs do verses 19 and 20 say will precede the Day of the Lord?
- 7. Who does verse 21 say will be saved on the Day of the Lord?
- 8. What evidence does verse 22 cite to prove Jesus' identity? Who does Peter say knows these things?
- 9. According to verse 23, Who planned to put Jesus to death? Who carried out these plans?
- 10. According to verse 24, what did God do after Jesus died? Why did this have to happen?
- 11. In verses 25-28, Peter applies Psalm 16:8-11 to Jesus' experience. How does verse 25 describe Jesus' relationship with the Father?
- 12. According to verse 26, how did Jesus feel about this relationship?
- 13. According to verse 27, what was Jesus sure the Father would not let happen to Him?
- 14. According to verse 28, what was Jesus sure would happen to Him instead?
- 15. Why does Peter insist in verse 29 that verses 27-28 don't apply to David?
- 16. How does Peter describe David in verse 30? What promise did God make to David?
- 17. According to verse 31, which of David's descendants was he really talking about in verse 27?
- 18. In verse 32, what did Peter say that he and the rest of the apostles had witnessed?
- 19. What two reasons does verse 33 give for Jesus' ability to pour out His Spirit?
- 20. Describing Jesus' ascension into heaven in verses 34 and 35, Peter quotes from Psalm 110:1. Who does David call "My Lord?" What does the Lord tell "My Lord" to do and for how long?
- 21. What two titles does verse 36 say God gave to Jesus? What did Peter's listeners do to Jesus?
- 22. What effect does verse 37 say that Peter's sermon had on his listeners?
- 23. What question did Peter's listeners ask him?
- 24. In verse 38, what two things does Peter tell his listeners to do? What promise does he make them?
- 25. For whom does verse 39 say the promise of God is valid?
- 26. How many people does verse 41 say responded to Peter's call?

## Summary and Application:

- 1. Verses 17 and 18 state that God's spirit will be poured out on both men and women. Given the state of modern American culture, why is this especially important?
- 2. Compare verses 19 and 20 with Mark 13:24-27. What do you expect to happen on the day that Christ returns? What do you need to do to get ready for that Day?
- 3. Given verse 23, how do you understand the connection between God's sovereign plans and man's responsibility for his own sinful actions?
- 4. Why is it significant that Peter quotes from the Old Testament so many times during his sermon?
