Review:

- 2. How does the knowledge that Jesus suffered the consequences of other people's sinful decisions help to put your own difficulties into perspective?

- 18. According to verse 27, what affect did the fire have on the three friends?
- 19. According to verse 28, Who did Nebuchadnezzar give credit for the three friends' deliverance?
- 20. How did Nebuchadnezzar describe the faithfulness of the three friends?
- 21. What command did Nebuchadnezzar make concerning the God of the three friends?

Summary and Application:

1. The three friends said they did not need to answer the accusations leveled against them. How does this foreshadow Jesus' experience when He stood before the religious and political rulers who accused Him? What does this say about the power of God when compared to human authorities?
