The King of the Jews Luke 23:26-43

Review:

- 1. The King of the Jews pronounces judgment on all those who remain in rebellion against Him, with His cross showing us what we all deserve
- 2. The King of the Jews loves and forgives even the worst of sinners, with His cross showing the great sacrifice He has made for all who trust in Him
- 3. The King of the Jews does not promise to release His followers from our worldly sufferings. Instead, His cross shows us the self-sacrificial way we are called to live.
