Romans 13:11-14

Review:

- 1. A principal motivation for Christian living is the fact that Christ is coming soon to complete God's plan of salvation by judging and destroying all the evil in the world.
- 2. So, we should not living in the darkness, living for our own pleasures, focusing our lives on the things of this world.
- 3. Instead, we are to put on the armor of light, the protection that comes from living lives of honesty, transparency, sincerity and integrity.
- 4. The only way we can live such lives is to put on Christ, to have the Holy Spirit living within us.

Go Further: Read I John 1:5-2:11

- 1. In verses 1:5-7, John contrasts light and darkness. Which one of these is associated with God?
- 2. In Hebrew thought, "walking" means the way that we live. How does walking in the darkness affect our relationship with God? Why do you think this is the case?
- 3. What two relationships does walking in the light strengthen?
- 4. In verses 1:8-10, John talks about the importance of confession. Why would walking in the light always include confession of sin?
- 5. What two things does God promise to those who confess their sin?
- 6. In verse 1:8, John says that failure to confess our sins involves self-deception. Why would this be a natural consequence of walking in the darkness?
- 7. In 2:1-2, John explains how God can promise the forgiveness offered in 1:9. What two parts does Jesus play in this plan, and what is involved with each of these roles?
- 8. In 2:3-6, John explains the connection between obedience to Christ and really knowing Him. How does our obedience increase our assurance that we belong to God?
- 9. If we are truly obeying Christ, how will we walk, how will we live?
- 10. In verses 7-11, John tells us how love for one another is a critical part of walking in the light. Why does he call this an old commandment in verse 7?
- 11. Why do you think he calls love for one another a new commandment in verse 8? (see John 13:34-35)
- 12. In verses 9 and 11, what does John say is the connection between hate and darkness? What affect does hate have on the person that hates?
- 13. In verse 10, what does John say is the connection between love and light?

- 1. Have you had a time in your life when you were deceiving yourself?
- 2. If we want to be in a right relationship with God, what steps do we need to take every day to walk in the light?
- 3. If we want to be in a right relationship with other people, what steps do we need to take every day to walk in the light?
