- 5. What two pieces of equipment does Paul tell us to take up in verse 14? How might these help us in our fight?
- 6. In verse 15, what do you think is the connection between shoes and the preparation of the gospel of peace? How does this equipment help us in our fight?
- 7. In verse 16, from what does Paul promise us that faith protects us? Why do you think this is the case?
- 8. What two pieces of equipment does Paul prescribe in verse 17, and how should we use these things?
- 9. In verse 18, Paul turns from equipment to action what does he tell us to do while we are wearing all this armor?
- 10. How does Paul say we should pray?
- 11. What specific prayer request does Paul make in verses 19 and 20? How does this inform how we should pray for ourselves? How does this inform our own priorities?
- 12. What does Paul's situation in verse 20 tell us about the inevitability of spiritual warfare?

- 2. What concrete steps can we take to incorporate this sort of spiritual preparation into our daily lives?
