Holy Fear II Corinthians 6:11-7:1

Review:

- 1. While we are called to share the good news with unbelievers, calling them into life with Christ, we must not be yoked to them as they pull away from Him.
- 2. We are called to holiness and we are enabled to pursue holiness, to be set apart for God, because all Christians are filled with His Holy Spirit
- Christ has died to take our sins upon Himself and thus make us holy. This should inspire in us a loving reverence and awe that makes us want to live into the reality of holiness.

- 2. What two things does God want His people to do in verse 2?
- 3. What two conditions does God place on His blessings in verse 3?
- 4. What blessing does God promise in verses 4 and 5 and 10?
- 5. What blessing does God promise in verses 6 through 8?
- 6. What blessing does God promise in verse 9?
- 7. In verses 9, 11 and 12, God describes the nature of His relationship with His obedient people. How would you describe this relationship?
- 8. What relationship does God reaffirm in verse 13? Is there any conditional language in this verse?
- 9. What does God remind His people that He has done for them? Why did God say He had delivered His people?

Apply:

- 1. Why do you think our obedience is necessary for us to have a close, healthy relationship with God?
- 2. How should the fact of our salvation (verse 13) move us to greater obedience to God?
- 3. What daily steps can we take to strengthen our relationship with God?
