Review:

- 2. What example does he give of this kind of attitude in verses 2 and 3?
- 3. In verse 4, what does James say this kind of attitude does to us and the way we think?
- 4. In verse 5, how does James say God has blessed the poor? Why do you think poverty affects people in this way?
- 5. In verses 6 and 7, what does James say rich people tend to do? Why do you think they might tend to behave this way?
- 6. In verse 8, what law does James direct us to follow? How will following this law help us to avoid playing favorites?
- 7. In verse 9, James clearly states that playing favorites breaks God's law. Why do you think this is the case?
- 8. According to verse 10, why is James making such a big deal out of showing favoritism?
- 9. How does verse 12 tell us to speak and act? Why do you think the law of liberty should keep us from favoring only certain people?
- 10. In verse 13, how does James warn those who are not merciful?
- 11. What does James say will triumph over judgment? How should this motivate us to show mercy to everyone?

Apply:

- 1. Are some people treated differently than others in your congregation? If so, why? What can you do about correcting this kind of attitude?
- 2. How might showing favoritism to some people discourage others from worshipping with your congregation?
- 3. How can you help your congregation be more welcoming of everyone?
