- 8. According to verse 9, what is the result of Jesus' humility? How does this fulfill Jesus' words in Mark 9:35?
- 9. How does Jesus' humility lead to unity among people in verses 10 and 11? What will all people do as a result of Jesus' humility?
- 10. In verse 12, Paul tells us to do good works that flow out of our salvation. Given the flow of his thought up to this point, what kind of works do you think he is talking about?
- 11. According to verse 13, how will we be able to do these good works?
- 12. What particular example of humility does Paul give us in verse 14? How hard is this to do?
- 13. In verse 15, how does Paul say the rest of the world will see our humble behavior?
- 14. What does Paul tell us to hold forth in verse 16? How does our humility help us to do this?
- 15. What example of humility does Paul give us in verse 17? How can we help others to serve and be faithful?
- 16. In verse 18, how does Paul say we should feel about living the life of Christ and seeing others live that life?
