## All in This Together Joshua 7:1-26

Review:

- 1. In spite of our rationalizations, we are called to obey God, even when it doesn't make sense.
- 2. In spite of our individualism, the actions of one person can make a big impact on others.
- 3. It is the responsibility of the whole church to help one another see our sin, confess our sin, and remove sin from our midst

Go Further: Read Genesis 2:16-17

- 1. What did God allow Adam to do in verse 16? When temptations arise, why is it important for us to remember how richly God has blessed us?
- 2. What did God forbid Adam from doing in verse 17?
- 3. What did God say would happen to Adam if he did what was forbidden?

Read Genesis 3:17-19

- 4. How did God describe Adam's sin in verse 17? Have you ever followed Adam's example?
- 5. What did God say in verses 17-19 would happen to the ground because of Adam's sin? How would this make Adam's work difficult? How does this curse make our work difficult?
- 6. In verse 19, what did God say would eventually happen to Adam? How do all of Adam's descendants share in this curse?

Read Romans 5:12-19

- 7. Whose sin is Paul describing in verse 12? What does Paul say happened to everyone because of this sin?
- 8. In verse 14, what does Paul say happened to everyone from the time of Adam to the time of Moses? What caused this to happen?
- 9. A type is someone or something that foreshadows or mimics a person or event that comes later in history. Of Whom does Paul say Adam is a type?
- 10. In verses 15-19, Paul explains how Adam's effect on his descendants is similar to what Christ did for His people. What happened because of Adam's transgression?
- 11. Why does Paul say God's grace abounded to many people?
- 12. In verse 16, what does Paul say Adam's judgment led to? What did God's free gift in Christ lead to?
- 13. In verse 17, what does Paul say happened because of Adam's transgression? In contrast, what does Jesus Christ bring His people?
- 14. In verse 18, what does Paul say was the result of Adam's one transgression? What is the result of Christ's act of righteousness?
- 15. In verse 19, what does Paul say happened because of Adam's disobedience? What happened because of Christ's obedience?

Apply:

- 1. How does knowing that we experience the consequences of Adam's sin help us understand human nature?
- 2. How does knowing that we can receive the consequences of Jesus' righteousness help us understand God's plan of salvation?
- 3. How does the idea of experiencing the consequences of other people's actions help us build our communities and congregations?
