## Preparing the Way Matthew 3:1-12

## Review:

- 1. The One we need to travel on the highway into our hearts is Christ we must cast off all idolatry
- 2. We need to confess that without Christ we are in a desperate situation we must cast off all complacency
- 3. There is no room in God's roadway for obstacles we must cast off all pride
- 4. The good news is that God has come to us in the Person and Work of Christ.

## Go Further - Read Isaiah 40:1-31

- What reasons does God give in verses 1 and 2 that His people should take comfort?
- 2. In verse 3, where does the voice of the one crying come? In what ways is your life or the world around you similar to this place?
- 3. What does the crying voice say needs to be done to prepare the way of the Lord?
- 4. What does verse 4 say will happen to the hills and the valleys? To what kinds of people or problems do you think these two kinds of places refer?
- 5. What does verse 5 say will be revealed? Who will get to see this?
- 6. What message does the voice bring in verses 6 and 7? How should this fact affect our priorities?
- 7. How does the contrast presented in verse 8 strengthen your faith?
- 8. What message does God want pronounced in verse 9? Why would this have been such good news to the people of Isaiah's time? Why is this good news to you?
- 9. What things do verses 10-11 say God will do when He appears?
- 10. Starting in verse 12, Isaiah begins to compare God with all the false idols that so many other nations worship. How does verse 12 describe God's power in creation?
- 11. How do verses 13 and 14 compare God's wisdom with all who try to advise Him?
- 12. According to verses 15-17, how do all the nations compare to God's power and glory?
- 13. How do verses 19 and 20 describe the false gods of the nations? Compared to verses 12-17, how impressive are these idols?
- 14. How do verses 21-23 compare God's power with the most powerful people on earth?
- 15. What does verse 24 say about the impermanence of even the greatest of mankind?
- 16. What example of God's power is given in verse 26? Why should modern people find this especially impressive?
- 17. What incorrect assumption do the people of Israel make in verse 27?
- 18. What does Isaiah tell the people about God in verse 28? Why should this reassure them? How does this truth reassure you?
- 19. What promises does Isaiah make to the people in verses 29-31?

## Apply:

- 1. What kinds of things inspire fear in you? How does meditating on God's power, wisdom, and glory help to put those fears into perspective?
- 2. Which of the promises of God that you find in this passage bring you the most comfort? Why?
