- 9. According to verses 16 and 17, into what two categories does John divide sin?
- 10. Read John 8:21-24. How does this help you understand "sin unto death?"
- 11. According to verse 18, what relationship does John say is essential to protecting us from sin?
- 12. What does John say those who have been born of God tend to do? What do you think he means?
- 13. Into what two categories does John divide all people in verse 19?
- 14. In verse 20, what knowledge does John say is essential for God's people? What relationship is essential for us?
- 15. What warning does John give us in verse 21?

Apply:
