Review:

- 1. Corporate worship convicts us of our sin as we gather around the Word of God
- 2. Corporate worship gives us an opportunity to praise God for His saving grace
- 3. Corporate worship allows us to bless others who are going through times of dryness or grief

- 1. What does Peter say about the permanence of God's Word? Why should this motivate us to spend more time reading and learning it?
- 2. How does Peter say in 2:1 that God's Word should change our behavior? Why do you think this is the case?
- 3. In 2:2, in what way does Peter say we should long for God's Word? What does he say God's Word will help us to do?
- 4. To what does Peter compare Jesus in 2:4?
- 5. How does Peter compare the way people think about Jesus with the Father's reaction to Him?
- 6. Who does Peter say we are in 2:5? Because of this, what does Peter say we should be doing?
- 7. In 2:6, Peter quotes from Isaiah 28:16. To what does Isaiah compare Jesus? What promise does he make to those who trust in Him?
- 8. In 2:7, Peter quotes from Psalm 118:22. This is the same Psalm from which the people quoted on Palm Sunday, when they said, "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord" (Psalm 118:26, compare Matthew 21:9). On that occasion, who rejected Jesus?
- 9. What does Psalm 118 say would happen after the cornerstone was rejected? In what way did this happen to Jesus?
- 10. In 2:8, Peter quotes from Isaiah 8:14. What does Peter say will happen to those who don't trust in Christ when they encounter Him?
- 11. In what ways does Peter describe believers in 2:9? Why does he say we should praise God?
- 12. In 2:10, how does Peter describe the change in the status of believers?
- 13. What behavior does Peter warn us against in 2:11? Why do you think he calls believers "strangers and pilgrims?"
- 14. How do you think what Peter calls "fleshly lusts" make war against our souls? Given the list in 2:1, what kinds of things do you think Peter is talking about?

Apply:

- 1. Are you satisfied with your daily and weekly interaction with God's Word? What changes would you like to make in your study of the Scriptures?
- 2. How might God's Word become a stumbling block for those who don't trust Jesus? What can you say and do to help people get over these stumbling blocks?
- 3. In what particular ways can you live out your status as a living stone in the Temple of God and as a member of a holy priesthood?
