Review:

- 1. Those who try to show and share the gospel of Christ will face opposition from all sides from those in authority as well as from family and friends.
- 2. In spite of the threats against us, as sheep in the midst of wolves we must speak the Word of the Shepherd
- 3. Instead of picking fights, we must be wise as serpents, knowing when to cut our losses
- 4. At the same time, we must be as guileless and innocent as doves, speaking and living in an open and unoffensive manner
- 5. No matter what opposition may come our way, we should not be afraid, for God knows us as well as the sparrows and cares so much more for us.

- 13. For what reasons does verse 14 say that we are blessed?
- 14. In verse 15, what kind of suffering does Peter say is not a blessing?
- 15. According to verse 16, how does Peter say that Christians should respond to their suffering?
- 16. With what group of people does verse 17 say that God's judgment begins?
- 17. What does verse 19 say that those who suffer according to God's will should do?
