### Herod's Banquet Matthew 14:1-12

### Review:

- 1. The wealthy and powerful have never had much use for Biblical standards of holiness
- 2. Many imagine that we can seek happiness by tolerating or encouraging sin in our lives
- 3. Sowing to the flesh leads only to death, while sowing to the Spirit leads to eternal life

# Reflect:

1. Is there anyone or anything to which you are looking for happiness that isn't in agreement with God's Word? What changes do you need to make to follow Christ more consistently?

## Go further: Read Galatians 5:22-6:10

- 1. According to verses 22 and 23, what are the nine characteristics of the fruit that the Holy Spirit bears in a Christian's life?
- 2. What does verse 24 say that those who belong to Jesus have done?
- 3. In verse 25, how does Paul say we should live and walk?
- 4. What behaviors does verse 26 say are incompatible with living in the Spirit?
- 5. How does verse 1 say we should treat a fellow Christian who has fallen into sin?
- 6. Why does Paul say all Christians should consider ourselves, or keep watch on ourselves?
- 7. How does verse 2 say that we should fulfill the law of Christ?
- 8. In verse 3, how does Paul say we can deceive ourselves? How did Herod do this in our passage from Matthew 14?
- 9. What does verse 4 say is a good way for us to avoid such self-deception?
- 10. Comparing verses 2 and 5, what different points do you think Paul is making, first about our temptations and second about the things in which we might take pride?
- 11. In verse 6, with whom does Paul say we should share good things?
- 12. In verse 7, what does Paul insist that everyone will reap? Why would denying this truth be a mockery to God?
- 13. In verse 8, what does Paul promise that someone who sows to the flesh will reap?
- 14. What will someone reap who sows to the Spirit?
- 15. In verse 9, what does Paul encourage us not to allow to happen while we are trying to do good?
- 16. What does he promise we will be able to do eventually, or in due season?
- 17. In verse 10, what does Paul urge us to do whenever we have the opportunity?

## Summary and Application:

- 1. What aspects of the fruit of the Spirit do you wish your life displayed more consistently?
- 2. How did Jesus model for us the things Paul encourages all Christians to do in verses 1 and 2?
- 3. How have you sowed to the flesh in your life? How can you more consistently sow to the Spirit?
