## Righteous or Sinner? Matthew 9:9-13

## Review:

- 1. We have no room to think of ourselves as more righteous than anyone else
- 2. Jesus came to call sinners to repentance, to turn away from our sin
- 3. Being in fellowship with Jesus always involves sharing His love with other sinners

- 1. How does God describe His people's faithfulness in verse 4?
- 2. In verse 5, how does God say He will slay His people?
- 3. How does God describe His judgments?
- 4. What two things does verse 6 say that God wants most? What two things are of lesser importance to Him?
- 5. What does God accuse His people of doing in verse 7?
- 6. Gilead is the region east of the Jordan River where people from the tribes of Manasseh and Gad lived. How does God describe them in verse 8?
- 7. What does God say the priests are doing in verse 9?
- 8. What horrible thing does God see in verse 10? Who does God say is involved in these things?
- 9. What does God say will happen to Judah in verse 11?
- 10. What does Hosea call the people to do in verse 1?
- 11. What two things does he say God has done to the people? How does he promise that God will help them?
- 12. What does Hosea say God will do for the people in verse 2? When does he say this will happen?
- 13. Who does Hosea urge the people to know in verse 3?
- 14. How does Hosea promise that God will come to His people? What do you think this image meant to people living in a dry area like Israel?

## Apply:

- 1. In what areas of your life do you find it hard to remain faithful to God? What kinds of sins do you find yourself slipping back into again and again?
- 2. Verse 5 speaks of the words of God's prophets slaying the wicked. How might this be true in today's culture? What parts of God's Word do you personally find most convicting?
- 3. Given God's priorities as expressed in verse 6, what changes do you need to make in how you use your time, talents, and treasure?
- 4. Verse 9 mentions Shechem, the place where Joshua and the people of Israel affirmed the covenant with the Lord during the initial conquest of the Promised Land (Joshua 8:30-35). Why would the actions of the priests described in that verse be so especially horrible in that place?
- 5. What connection do you see between verse 2 and the Resurrection of Christ? What is the connection between Jesus' resurrection and the new life that Hosea promises to the people of God?
